Annual Enrollment and Program Report: 2019 – 2020 School Year

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Executive Summary

The 2019-2020 school year proved to be a challenging one to say the least. All schools in the K-12 education space ended the academic year in a way that few could have foreseen during the fall of 2019. The COVID-19 global pandemic has reshaped and redefined what we expect and value in our educational institutions. Schools were suddenly thrust to center stage and asked to develop a decade's worth of innovations in two weeks or less. Focus shifted to providing a quality educational experience in a different way and it became clear that instructional strategies, technology infrastructure, and leadership that can happen from a distance would be the focus moving into the 2020-2021 school year.

Since most North Dakota Center for Distance Education (NDCDE or CDE) products and services were already provided prior to the pandemic, NDCDE did not see a significant, immediate impact in terms of additional enrollments. NDCDE's local staff was certainly impacted with the transition to working remotely. Overall, the greatest need from NDCDE's students was extended time in the classes they were already working on and transitioning to allow parents to supervise student classes at home. NDCDE is predicting a much larger impact during the 2020-2021 school year as schools and parents search for quality digital or distance learning platforms.

NDCDE's core service offering during the 2019-2020 school year continued to be online courses. Online courses at NDCDE are made available to both in state and outstate students. NDCDE continued to rely on the revenue generated from outstate students to offset the cost for ND students. NDCDE's instate enrollment count totaled 4,805 (2,659 unique students) a 7% increase from the 2018-2019 school year. Outstate enrollments totaled 1,195 (552 unique students) for a total enrollment count of 6,000 (3,211 unique students).

Students that took online courses relied upon curriculum integrated into NDCDE's Learning Management System (LMS) using 19 different online course suppliers in 17 different content areas. The vastness of curriculum offerings continued to fulfill NDCDE's promise of choice and opportunity to all students regardless of location. NDCDE relied on 44 full and part time ND licensed instructors to work with students in these courses for an organization wide successful student completion rate of 83.9% (successful completion equates to a final grade of 60% or higher).

In addition to online courses, NDCDE saw growth in its Comprehensive Educational Services (CES) as 5 new ND SmartLabs were installed and are being supported in schools for a statewide total of 19. More schools and organizations have taken advantage of NDCDE's Local Virtual Model (LVM) formerly known as Course Only Local Teacher (COLT) program along with NDCDE's course building and hosting services. Additionally, NDCDE has continued to offer its College Lab for English and Math (CLEM) which targets students that may need remedial course work upon entering college.

Finally, NDCDE's diploma program has helped 32 graduates earn high school diplomas. NDCDE's diploma program had 93 active students during the school year who took a total of 509 courses to stay on track for graduation.

About North Dakota Center for Distance Education

North Dakota Center for Distance Education (NDCDE) or commonly referred to as Center for Distance Education (CDE) is both a non-profit governmental agency and a school. It has served as the center for distance learning in the state of North Dakota since 1935. CDE's purpose is to provide learning opportunities for K-12 learners in North Dakota regardless of where they live. Nearly 85 years ago, CDE fulfilled this purpose through correspondence courses. Fast forward to today and CDE provides online, digital learning opportunities along with additional comprehensive educational services to North Dakota K-12 learners, parents, and school districts.

As a governmental agency, CDE falls underneath governance of the North Dakota Career and Technical Education Department. According to North Dakota Century Code, CDE is a direct report to the North Dakota Career and Technical Education Board of Directors. This current governance model has been in place since the beginning of the 2019-2021 biennium. CDE is also a fully accredited K-12 school with Cognia. CDE meets all requirements for curriculum and instruction set forth by the North Dakota Department of Public Instruction (NDDPI). In addition, CDE is an approved online course provider by the NCAA for prospective student athletes seeking college eligibility.

CDE's mission is to ensure that all North Dakota students regardless of location have access to educational opportunities that meet or exceed customer expectations for

- the quality of curriculum,
- ongoing contact time with highly qualified teachers,
- · monitoring course delivery efficiency and effectiveness, and
- student learning.

CDE envisions a future in which it becomes a recognized leader in education because of how it helps, serves, nurtures, guides, and encourages every North Dakota learner, providing them with the opportunity to take charge of their own learning.

CDE's enabling legislation allows it to target three specific strategies to realize this envisioned future.

- 1. CDE provides online courses which meet customer expectations for both curriculum and instruction.
- 2. CDE leverages its infrastructure to provide additional comprehensive educational services that help to achieve the mission.
- 3. CDE provides a diploma program for learners looking to complete their high school education solely online.

This annual report provides highlights for the 2019-2020 school year for CDE's online learning program, comprehensive educational supporting programs, and the diploma program.

CDE 2019-2020 Objectives and Key Results

Objective #1: Increase annual ND online enrollments *Key Result:* Annual increase of 3% <u>Actual:</u> +7% from the 2018-2019 school year.

Objective #2: Provide hands-on, project-based learning to students regardless of location. *Key Result:* 10 SmartLabs installed during the 19-21 biennium. <u>Actual:</u> 5 new SmartLabs installed and supported.

Objective #3: Increase organizational efficiencies.

Key Result #1.1: Decrease customer entered enrollment errors annually. <u>Actual:</u> Decreased from 264 to 191.

Key Result #1.2: Decrease average time needed for billing collection. <u>Actual:</u> 69.59% paid in the first 61 days during the 2018-2019 school year to 74.71% paid during the first 61 days during the 2019-2020 school year.

Objective #4: Increase student learning.

Key Result: Successful completion rate above 90% for CDE online courses during the 2019-2020 school year.

<u>Actual:</u> 84%.

Objective #5: Increase quality opportunities for learners.

Key Result 1.1: Increase CDE course options utilizing adaptive technology during the 2019-2020 school year.

Actual: Increased from 4 to 8 semester opportunities.

Key Result 1.2: Launch two courses annually that are competency-based. <u>Actual:</u> 0 competency-based courses launched during the 2019-2020 school year.

Online Courses


State of Online Learning in North Dakota

Both fully online and blended learning opportunities have continued to increase for K-12 students across the state of North Dakota. NDDPI, when assembling its choice ready essential skills for schools helped make a significant stride forward in this direction by requiring that for a learner to be considered choice ready, they successfully complete at least one online course.

CDE completes an annual clearinghouse supported by ND Century Code where all ND schools are surveyed to provide a clearer picture regarding the usage of online or digital learning in the state of ND. Typically, all school districts are required to complete this survey. Because of the outbreak of COVID-19 by mid-March of 2020, only 129 of ND's 175 school districts completed this year's survey. This was intentional as CDE wanted to make sure that the data obtained for the 2019-2020 school year was pre-COVID-19. Figure 1 shows the demographic breakdown of school sizes that completed this year's survey based on student population.


Participant school size



When districts were asked if they provide online or blended learning opportunities for their students, 93% of districts surveyed replied yes. School districts indicated over a dozen different online providers that they partner with to provide online learning opportunities. The two largest providers in the state were NDCDE and the North Dakota Virtual Career and Technical Centers accounting for 121 of the 129 districts surveyed. Other online course providers partnering with schools in ND were: Accellus, Arizona State Digital Prep, Compass, Edgenuity, Edmentum, Jeffco, Odysseyware, and Pearson.

In addition to understanding the landscape of online providers working in ND, schools are continuing to purchase and manage their own Learning Management Systems (LMS) which are a necessity when offering either fully online or blended learning options for students. Figure 2 indicates the most used LMS's throughout ND.




Number of districts and their corresponding LMS

Core subject areas such as English, Science, Math, and Social Studies reported the highest enrolled in online courses, while other Career and Tech areas such as Health Sciences, Agriculture, and Information Technology continue to gain in popularity as well.

For online education to be successful, online learning infrastructure must also be in place. All districts are now completely connected with high speed internet access for students. Hardware availability and types of operating systems do however vary from district to district. Of the 129 districts responding in the survey, 68.2% indicated they either already have one device for every student in their district that the student can take home, or they are working to become a 1:1 district. The survey further indicated that the three predominant devices/operating systems used for online courses in ND are Apple OS, Windows PC. and Chromebook, shown in Figure 3.

In some instances, schools are unable to fill full time teacher positions. In these instances, some districts seek to have an online provider fill that vacancy. Out of the 129 responding districts, 32 indicated that they were unable to fill a teacher vacancy during the previous school year. Of those 32 districts, 17 decided to partner with an online learning provider to fill the teacher vacancy. Many of those unfilled vacancies occurred in Career and Technical Education courses

such as Agriculture and Family and Consumer Science with Math and Art subject areas also showing significant shortages for staff.

Center for Distance Education Instate Enrollment Report

During the 2019-2020 school year, CDE partnered with a total of 163 North Dakota schools to provide online learning opportunities for their students (Appendix A shows a complete breakdown of ND schools with students taking CDE online courses). Table 1 shows the breakdown of total enrollments and unique students taking online courses where CDE supplied both the curriculum and the instructor during the 2019-2020 school year and shows the distinction between homeschool students and students still enrolled in an ND school.

Center for Distance Education Out of State Enrollment Report

During the 2019-2020 school year, CDE provided online courses and instruction to 156 different out of state affiliations or homeschool students. CDE uses capacity with its full and part time instructors to extend its service offerings to non-ND residents. Table 2 shows the breakdown of total enrollments and unique students taking online courses where CDE supplied both the curriculum and the instructor during the 2019-2020 school year and shows the distinction between homeschool, international, and students affiliated with a non-ND school.

Center for Distance Education Instructor Report

CDE relies on both full-time equivalent instructors and part time temporary adjunct instructors to provide a quality instructional experience for students. To meet student expectations for 24-hour assignment turnaround time, feedback, and communication, CDE employed 33 part time temporary adjunct instructors and 11 full time instructors. In addition, 6 CDE administrators provided instruction in course sections throughout the school year. All instructors held current ND teacher licenses in the areas they were assigned to instruct. As CDE's enrollment total has continued to grow, there has been an increased reliance on part time temporary adjuncts to fill that need. Part time temporary adjuncts allow greater flexibility since they receive a salary only when enrollment totals in particular curricular areas necessitate it. Most part time temporary adjuncts are also fully employed in other North Dakota schools throughout the state.

CDE uses a measure referred to as successful completion rates to monitor the effectiveness of instruction. Successful completion rates refer to the percentage of students that both finish their CDE course and have a final percentage grade of 60% or higher. During the 2019-2020 school year, CDE saw an organization wide successful online course completion rate of 83.9%. This successful completion rate is identical to the successful completion rates over the past 3 school years.

Center for Distance Education Online Curriculum Report

To provide high quality digital content that best meets student's needs, CDE made a conscious effort nearly ten years ago to no longer design its own digital content except for unique situations. Instead, CDE partners with over a dozen different nationally recognized online course providers to use their professionally designed curriculum after an extensive vetting process.

CDE partnerships depend on agreements with course suppliers that can meet the expectations of CDE. The supplier must offer a pre-built digital course that can be imported into CDE's Learning Management System (LMS) which is currently Buzz. Next, all courses must meet CDE quality standards along with North Dakota learning standards set by the ND Department of Public Instruction (NDDPI). Finally, contact and conversation with suppliers is important, and CDE must be able to have direct communication for ease with continual improvement. Table 3 shows the complete list of online curriculum providers that CDE used during the 2019-2020 school year and the total enrollments committed to each course provider.

Comprehensive Educational Services

ND SmartLab Program

CDE has partnered with a curriculum provider called Creative Learning Systems (CLS) to provide a blended, project-based learning program designed for North Dakota schools and their students in grades K-12. The program is often described as STEAM focused, but blends curriculum content from all core areas. ND SmartLabs is a turn-key approach to bringing learning opportunities to students that focus on the development of problem-solving skills, critical thinking, collaboration, creativity, and design principals. The ND SmartLab has been customized for ND schools regardless of their size or location.

In a SmartLab, students learn content through cloud based information contained in a "learning launchers" A learning launcher contains all the information that the student and their partner will need for successful project completion including; content knowledge, project instructions, and extension activities. Each SmartLab also comes with designed templates to authentically assess students using journals, presentations, and self-reflections.

SmartLabs come equipped with Dell all-in-one computers, additional hardware, software, and fully assembled project kits that are needed for a successful completion of the learning launchers. The only thing supplied by the local school is room to place the SmartLab, tables and chairs needed for students and equipment and an onsite learning facilitator that will be trained in the environment.

The SmartLab project began during the 2015 school year. Since then, CDE has provided curriculum, support, and training to over 50 facilitators. In 2015, no SmartLabs existed in ND, at the end of the 2020 school year there were 19 operational SmartLabs statewide. Table 5 shows a breakdown of where these SmartLabs are currently in operation and how many students they serve.

Local Virtual Model (formerly known as COLT)

The Local Virtual Model (LVM) is a program at CDE that allows the use of CDE vetted online courses using CDE's LMS. These courses are made available to teachers statewide in their local school districts for use in their classrooms or in an online hybrid environment. CDE provides training for the onsite classroom teachers to navigate the LMS and to operate and interact successfully in the online courses. In addition, CDE provides technical support for the local instructor and students. Most CDE courses are available for this program for a per enrollment fee. Table 6 shows participation in the LVM program during the 19-20 school year.

CDE Course Building and Hosting Program

Upon request, when CDE personnel have capacity, CDE staff members provide consulting work for course building and course hosting services. During the 2019-2020 school year, NDDPI requested that CDE provide support with helping individuals either employed or contracted by the department to provide online training programs in an LMS. CDE provided direct support to train and build early childhood training courses. Throughout the 2019-2020 school year, this program provided early childhood education training to 1,719 North Dakota early learning professionals.

CDE Diploma Program

Enrollments and Graduation

Center for Distance Education (CDE) has been awarding high school diplomas to students who complete North Dakota's requirement for high school graduation for over 60 years. First as a correspondence school and now as a digital school, CDE provides this service to students throughout North Dakota. CDE's diploma program is subject to all rules and regulations applied to other public schools in North Dakota, as administered and provided governance by the ND Department of Public Instruction.

It is important to note, that even though a student has declared CDE as the primary school where they will be awarded a diploma, CDE does not receive any foundation aid for that student. The state of North Dakota views that student as a homeschool student for funding purposes.

During the 2019-2020 school year, CDE had 93 active participants in its diploma program that where enrolled in 509 courses. Throughout the year, 32 of those students graduated from CDE.

Revenue and Tuition

In addition to receiving a general fund appropriation, CDE raises revenue through tuition and fees for all online courses and supporting programs and services. This revenue is needed to pay for CDE operational expenses directly related to the service being provided. The tuition and fees charged for instate CDE services during the 2019-2020 school year are listed below in Table 7. The tuition and fees charged for outstate services during the 2019-2020 biennium are listed below in Table 8. Note that NDSOS refers to a discount received by schools that are members of North Dakota Small Organized Schools.



Revenue Generated

NDCDE raised a total of \$677,511.00 from instate course purchases and \$358,020.00 from outstate course purchases. Revenue generated from comprehensive educational services equated to \$76,508. Figure 4 shows the revenue that was generated from these programs during the 2019-2020 school year.
