Dual Credit Agreement with Mayville State Renewed

NDCDE is excited to announce the renewal of its dual credit agreement with Mayville State University. This allows the continuation of online dual credit courses in college algebra, anatomy and physiology, and college composition, to name only a few. The courses are taught by NDCDE teachers who meet Higher Learning Commission standards on faculty qualifications. Credit Recovery Courses Update

With the exception of 9-12 language arts, NDCDE has phased out credit recovery courses. Students seeking these services should enroll in the equivalent high school course listed in our online store.

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Funds Available to Help Students Build Resilience Skills

Whether you are looking for a curriculum to complement your counseling services or support restorative approaches to school discipline, EmpowerU equips students with the skills to build persistence, resilience, and support systems by pairing interactive daily lessons with 1:1 support from dedicated online instructors.

NDCDE has partnered with EmpowerU and DPI to deliver this content to your students. DPI has dedicated \$100k to this program and over \$84k remains for the 2022-23 school year. DPI will reimburse half the \$390 cost of each enrollment through the Web Grants Portal once NDCDE reports enrollments to DPI.

Studies on the return on investment of programs like EmpowerU show an \$11 return on every \$1 spent. EmpowerU offers information on student outcomes on its website. To enroll your students or learn more about the program, click below.

Drop Fee Reinstated

To help school districts navigate the challenges of the pandemic, NDCDE temporarily suspended its \$20 per enrollment drop fee. We absorbed all operational costs associated with removing students from courses during this time. With demand for virtual courses now stabilized. NDCDE has reinstated the \$20 per enrollment drop fee. This fee is assessed after one business day of enrollment, affording an opportunity to correct any enrollment errors. Ryan is continuing to build dashboards to help NDCDE measure its effectiveness and reach.
